Anti-crime group, area churches to form human chain By Sylvina Poole

Commander Jo White explained why the Chain for Change is so important to the community. "First of all, prayer motivates people and gives them reasons to be kind and caring to others. It helps to give them all the attributes to be decent human beings. Prayer brings people together and makes us feel more like a family. Prayer connects us with the higher power. We ask and receive help from God in our efforts to cleanse the city of filth, which includes crime, theft, the dealing of drugs," she said.

White also hopes that the Chain for Change will bring more exposure to the problems in the North Side area and the city as a whole.

"By exposing the problems better, we hope that more people will get involved with community issues. With our community partners, I believe that we're on the brink of opening up a door that has been closed for a long time in the North Side, the door to unity in the community."

White explained that their stop the crime efforts begin with safety patrols.

"Our stop the crime and violence efforts start with our safety patrols. Our patrols are meant to show physical presence in the neighborhood to the negative elements that influence our community. We want them to know that we are not going to cower in the corner and let them take over our streets. They thrive on intimidating and putting fear in people and we want them to know that they have people in the community that are not afraid of them and are willing to stand up and fight back.

"When I say fight back, I don't mean physical confrontations. Very rarely do you see any Guardian Angels from New York to Los Angeles, Chicago, Baltimore, around the world, getting into confrontations.

"Today, gangs and dealers have become more organized and subtle. It now takes more sophistication and networking to uncover and deal with crime problems. This is one of the reasons our patrols have become smaller and emphasis has shifted from fighting skills to social and communication skills. Communication can make or break a situation. We need to be able to get out of trouble faster than we can get into it."

White continued, "Our physical presence is not only for those bad influences to see us out there but for the hard working people of the community as well. Being out there not only shows a physical presence but also a psychological presence giving more people the incentive to get involved.

"And yes indeed, people are really starting to get involved. Our community leaders are stepping up and being heard."

Although patrols are the main part of what Guardian Angels do across the country and across the globe, the group's stop the crime efforts in Richmond focus a lot on community unity, said White. "The community working together is powerful; that's been proven over and over again and it was proven in our National Night Out event."
