### LONG WALK TO FREEDOM

Over 10,000 men and women are released from the Richmond City Jail each year, but this year it was almost doubled that. A total of 18,213 men and women were released from the Richmond City Jail from July 1, 2012 – June 30, 2012. So we know important it is to help these individuals rebuild their lives to ensure that they don't return to jail or prison?

*The Long Walk to Freedom* is designed to achieve two goals: 1) raise awareness of the challenges facing released prisoners and 2) raise funds for programs that provide solutions to these challenges, we ask for a \$15 donation for that purpose. This year's walk was held on November 17, 2012. It began at Richmond City Jail at 9:00AM and end at Freedom House's Conrad Center on Oliver Hill Way. Along the way, walkers experienced the "virtual reality" of reentry issues from the perspective of released prisoners. They exit the Richmond City Jail and the challenges begin:
